What is a Cadetship?

A Cadetship Program enables you to gain practical and commercial experience whilst completing your university studies. The Cadetship Program structure varies between employers. A cadetship involves paid employment at the same time as you are studying your degree. This provides students with the opportunity to gain valuable industry experience while still at university.
